## FRAMYCETIN EYE DROPS

This document should be read in conjunction with this **DISCLAIMER** 

Restricted: Requires Neonatologist or Microbiologist review within 24 hours of initiation

Presentation	Ophthalmic solution 0.5% (5mg/mL)		
	Each 1mL contains: Framycetin 5mg/mL benzalkonium chloride as a preservative		
Classification	Aminoglycoside antimicrobial eye drop		
Indication	Bacterial eye infections.  Note: Framycetin is not active against <i>Pseudomonas</i> species		
Dose	Eye Drops: Instil ONE drop into the affected eye(s) every 2 hours for 24 hours; then reduce to ONE drop every 8 hours for a total of 5-7 days		
Dose Adjustment	Duration of therapy ranges from 5-7 days. To be reviewed according to response.		
Guidelines & Resources	Sepsis: General Management and Treatment		
Administration	SINGLE patient use ONLY		
	Eye toilets / care should be performed prior to the administration of each dose		
	Ensure the tip of the eye drop container does not come into contact with the infected eye(s).		
	Ensure adequate hand hygiene during and after administration to minimise the risk of infection Finger pressure applied to the lacrimal sac following application may help to reduce systemic absorption.		
Adverse Reactions	Common: Do not use eye drops for more than 7 days as chemical conjunctivitis may occur.		
	Rare: Local hypersensitivity reactions		
Storage	Store at room temperature - below 25°C.		
	Discard contents 28 days after opening.		

Notes	Framycetin is more likely to cause contact allergy than other aminoglycosides like gentamicin or tobramycin
