Scope (Staff): WNHS hospital-based midwifery group practice (MGP) staff

Scope (Area): Obstetrics and Gynaecology Directorate clinical areas at KEMH

Key points

- Continuity of care models have demonstrated improved clinical outcomes for women and their babies
- As an 'all risk' model MGP midwives promote collaborative care with an obstetric team where required.

Exclusion criteria

- Shared Care with General Practitioner (GP) or Endorsed Privately Practicing Midwife (EPPM)
- Women who meet the criteria for WANDAS, CAMI and Adolescent Clinic.
 AMGP may consider inclusion of these women.

Inclusion criteria (at commencement of care)

In reference to the <u>ACM National Midwifery Guidelines for Consultation and Referral (2021) (external website)</u>, MGP midwives will assume **midwifery** care of women who are level 'A', 'B' or 'C'.

Notes-

- A levels- Midwife assumes primary responsibility for the maternity care of the woman;
- ➢ B levels refer the woman's care to relevant medical practitioner or other health care provider, where the indications for referral will be reviewed and evaluated. A collaborative care plan will be developed with her midwifery team and obstetric care providers.
- C levels- refer the woman's care to relevant medical practitioner or other health care provider, where the indications for referral will be



reviewed and evaluated. A collaborative care plan will be developed with her midwifery team and obstetric care providers.

- > A- Discuss- Care provided by the midwife
- > B- Consult- Consult relevant medical practitioner or other health care provider
- > C- Refer- Refer to relevant medical practitioner or other health care provider
- Able to attend for all antenatal appointments per the <u>Midwifery care flowchart</u> quideline.
 - Non-attendance at 2 consecutive appointments with the MGP midwife, will deem a woman ineligible for MGP, as this model of care aims to establish and provide a continuity of care relationship between midwives and women.
- Priority given to KEMH catchment women. Women residing outside catchment area, may be considered depending on capacity.
 - Women who are accepted outside KEMH catchment area will be required to attend KEMH for all postnatal visits.
