Medication Class

Antiarrhythmic

Presentation

Ampoule: 150mg/3mL

Tablet: 200mg

Storage

Ampoule: Store below 25°C. Protect from light. **Tablet:** Store below 30°C. Protect from light.

Dose

IV Bolus Dosing (in Medical Emergency Situations Only)

Bolus doses are generally not recommended because of the risk of severe hypotension and circulatory collapse. Bolus doses should only be administered in medical emergency situations under close supervision and guidance of a senior medical officer

IV Infusion

Amiodarone is adsorbed onto PVC and leaches plasticiser from PVC. For continuous infusions that will exceed 2 hours, the solution must be prepared in polyolefin bag (Freeflex), rigid PVC bottle (e.g Braun), non-PVC burettes or Baxter Viaflo. The use of non-PVC bags is recommended for all infusions at WNHS

Monitoring

ECG, Blood pressure, Vital signs and as per anaesthetics

Pregnancy

Amiodarone should not be given to pregnant mothers unless critically required. Thyroid function of newborn should be assessed.

1st Trimester: Consider alternative
2nd Trimester: Monitoring required
3rd Trimester: Monitoring required

Breastfeeding

Monitoring required

Regular laboratory monitoring of the infant's amiodarone plasma level and cardiac and thyroid function are also recommended.
