Formulary: Restricted

Medication Class

Macrolide antibiotic

Presentation

Form:

Tablet: 500mg

Injection (powder for reconstitution): 500mg

Suspension: 200mg/5mL

Storage

Store at room temperature, below 25°C

Dose

Neisseria gonorrhoea

Oral:

1g as a single dose plus ceftriaxone 500mg IM

Chlamydia trachomatis +/- Ureaplasma urealyticum

Oral:

1g as a single dose

Pelvic Inflammatory Disease

Administration

IV Infusion

Step 1 Reconstitution: Reconstitute vial with 4.8mL water for injections. Final concentration is 100mg/mL

Step 2 Dilution: Dilute to 1mg/mL (500mg in 500mL) or to 2mg/mL (500mg in 250mL) with sodium chloride 0.9% or Glucose 5%

Step 3 Administration: Infuse over at least 60 minutes

Monitoring

IV therapy beyond 3 days should be discussed with ID physician or Clinical Microbiologist

Pregnancy

1st Trimester: Considered safe to use if it is the treatment of choice.

2nd Trimester: Considered safe to use3rd Trimester: Considered safe to use
