## **Medication Class**

Laxative

#### **Presentation**

Tablet: 120mg

**Combination product:** 

Tablet: Docusate 50mg/Senna 8mg

## **Storage**

Store at room temperature, below 25°C

#### Dose

## **Antenatal/Postnatal Constipation**

#### Oral:

120mg once or twice daily; maximum of 480mg daily in divided doses.

Constipation (Palliative Care) - use combination product

Oral:

1 – 2 tablet(s) once or twice daily; maximum of 4 tablets daily in divided doses.

#### Administration

### <u>Oral</u>

Take with plenty of fluid

1<sup>st</sup> Trimester: Safe to use
2<sup>nd</sup> Trimester: Safe to use
3<sup>rd</sup> Trimester: Safe to use
