Storage

Premarin® tablets, Progynova® 2mg tablet, Estraderm MX® patches, Sandrena® gel: Store below 25°C.

Progynova® 1mg tablet, Zoely® tablets, Femoston® tablets, Femoston-Conti® tablets, Angelig 1/2® tablets: Store below 30°C.

Estradot® patches: Store below 25°C, protect from light. Do not freeze.

Climara® patches: Store below 30°C, do not store unpouched and apply immediately after removal from protective pouch.

Kliovance® tablets, Kliogest® tablets, Trisequens® tablets, Ovestin® tablets: Store at room temperature, below 25°C in a dry place. Leave container in outer packaging to protect it from light.

Estalis Continuous® patches, Estalis Sequi® patches: Refrigerate, do not freeze. Store at 2-8°C. Can be stored below 25°C for up to 6 months or until the expiry date, whichever comes first.

Dose

Administration

Patch

Apply to clean, dry skin on your lower abdomen or buttocks. When changing the patch, remove the old patch and apply a new one to a different place.

Gel

Rub the contents of the sachet onto lower abdomen or thighs, covering an area one to two times the size of a hand. To avoid irritation, alternate the application site each day (eg left and right side). Do not apply to irritated skin. Avoid contact with your eyes and wash hands thoroughly after applying.

Monitoring

Symptoms of a blood clot (red, swollen or painful leg, chest pain, difficulty breathing), changes in breasts (skin or nipple changes or lumps) and changes in vaginal bleeding.

Estradiol with drospirenone

Monitor blood pressure & potassium

Pregnancy

1st Trimester: Contraindicated (conjugated estrogens & estradiol), consider alternative (estriol)

2nd Trimester: Contraindicated3rd Trimester: Contraindicated

Breastfeeding

Consider alternative
