## **Antimicrobial Restriction – Unrestricted (oral)**

Class	Antiviral			
Presentation	Tablet: 250mg			
Storage	Store at room temperature, below 25°C			
Dose	Genital herpes			
	Immunocompetent and normal renal function			
	Initial infection:			
	250mg orally, 8 hourly for 10 days.			
	If clinical response is rapid, stop therapy after 5 days			
	Episodic treatment:			
	1g orally, 12 hourly for 1 day			
	Suppressive treatment:			
	250mg orally, 12 hourly;			
	Treatment may be continuous, or interrupted at intervals to determine the natural history of disease and restarted in the event of frequent recurrences.			
	Orolabial herpes simplex (cold sores)			
	Immunocompetent and normal renal function:			
	Severe primary infection:			
	500mg orally, 12 hourly for 7 days			
	Infrequent, severe infection:			
	1500mg orally, as a single dose			
	<u>Shingles</u>			
	Immunocompetent and normal renal function:			
	500mg orally, 8 hourly for 7 days

	Drink plenty of fluids		
Pregnancy	1 <sup>st</sup> Trimester: Consider Alternative*		
	2 <sup>nd</sup> Trimester: Consider Alternative*		
	3 <sup>rd</sup> Trimester: Consider Alternative*		
	*Aciclovir is the most studied antiviral medicine and is considered the medicine of choice during pregnancy
