Iron supplement

## **Presentation**

Vial: 1g/20ml

## **Storage**

Store in the original package. Do not store above 30°C. Do not freeze, do not refrigerate.

# **Monitoring**

Blood pressure, heart rate, respiratory rate, oxygen saturation, temperature.

Follow up full blood picture and iron studies 4-6 weeks post infusion.

## **Pregnancy**

1<sup>st</sup> Trimester: Consider alternative

2<sup>nd</sup> Trimester: Safe to use 3<sup>rd</sup> Trimester: Safe to use
