Antimicrobial Restriction – IV/PO Monitored

Class	Antifungal			
Presentation	Capsule: 50mg			
	Capsule: 100mg			
	Capsule: 150mg			
	Capsule: 200mg			
	Suspension: 50mg/5mL			
	Vial: 200mg/100mL			
Storage	Vial: Store at room temperature, below 25°C. Do not refrigerate or freeze. Protect from light.			
Dose	Breast and nipple thrush:			
	Oral:			
	Nipple pain: 150 mg every second day until pain is resolved			
	Vulvovaginal candidiasis (topical therapy failed) Oral: Uncomplicated infection: 150 mg single dose.			
	Recurrent infection: 50 mg once daily until symptoms resolved (2 weeks to 6 months)			
	Relapse prevention: 50 mg once or twice weekly (titrate according to treatment response).			
	Oropharyngeal/oesophageal candidiasis			
	Oral/IV:			
	50–200 mg once daily (lower doses are usually used for oropharyngeal candidiasis). Up to 400 mg once daily can be used in oesophageal candidiasis.			
	Treat for 7–14 days in oropharyngeal candidiasis and for 14–21 days in oesophageal candidiasis.			

	Vulvodynia			
	Oral:			
	150mg per week for 6 weeks			
	Systemic candidiasis			
	Note: Not usually first line; seek specialist advice. Route: Oral/IV			
	12 mg/kg (maximum 800 mg) loading dose, then 6–12 mg/kg			
	(maximum 800 mg) once daily.			
Administration	Oral Can be taken with or without food			
	<u>IV</u>			
	Infuse undiluted over 1-2 hours. Do not exceed 200mg/hr.			
Pregnancy	1 st Trimester: Consider alternative			
	2 nd Trimester: Consider alternative			
	3 rd Trimester: Consider alternative

Breastfeeding	Considered safe to use			
Monitoring	Check for tiredness, nausea, dark urine, pale faeces or yellowing of the whites of eye or skin			
	Measure liver function and serum potassium concentration baseline and at regular intervals, depending on dose and duration treatment.
