## **GABAPENTIN**

## Formulary: Restricted

Class	Anticonvulsant			
Presentation	<b>Capsule:</b> 100mg, 300mg, 400mg			
	Vaginal Cream: 6% in combination with other medications (KEMH Only – seek specialist advice)			
Storage	Store at room temperature, below 25°C			
Dose	Menopausal Hot Flushes			
	Oral:			
	900mg/day in three divided doses.			
	Start at 300mg daily - initial night time dosing is preferable due to possible excessive sleepiness and dizziness.			
	Increase to 300mg three times a day over three to seven days.			
	Gabapentin dosing should be tapered over a 1 week period when it is discontinued.			
	Neuropathic Pain			
	Oral:			
	Initially 100mg - 300mg at night; increase dose gradually every 3 to 7 days according to response. Usual range: 900mg - 3600mg/day in 3 divided doses.			
	Focal (Partial) Seizures			
	Oral:			
	300mg on first day at bedtime; increase by 300mg daily up to 900mg - 1800mg daily in 3 doses. Up to 3600mg daily is required in some patients.			
Administration	Oral:			
Administration	Can be given without regard to food. Swallow capsules whole.			

	Vaginal Croam (KEMH Only): Sook engoinlist advice			
	Vaginal Cream (KEMH Only): Seek specialist advice  Wash hands well before and after use.			
Pregnancy	1 <sup>st</sup> Trimester: Consider alternative			
	2 <sup>nd</sup> Trimester: Consider alternative			
	3 <sup>rd</sup> Trimester: Consider alternative

Breastfeeding	Considered safe to use			
Monitoring	Avoid stopping abruptly (may cause anxiety, insomnia, nausea, pain and sweating); gradually reduce dose over at least a week.
