Medication Class

Hyperglycaemic

Presentation

Infusion Vial: 25g in 50mL

Storage

Store at room temperature, below 25°C

Dose

Refer to KEMH Adult Resuscitation Drug Protocol for appropriate dose regimes

Severe Hypoglycaemia

IV Injection

Dose: Inject 20 to 50mL SLOWLY (3mL/minute) depending on response and blood glucose levels

Hyperkalaemia (with insulin)

IV Injection

Dose: Inject 20 to 50mL SLOWLY (3mL/minute) depending on response and blood glucose levels

Administration

Glucose 50% is hypertonic so IV administration may cause local pain, vein irritation, local phlebitis or venous thrombosis. Inject slowly and avoid extravasation

IV Injection

Inject into a central venous access device. In the emergency treatment of severe hypoglycaemia inject the dose at a maximum rate of 3 mL/minute into a large peripheral vein. Inject slowly and use a small-bore needle.

IV infusion

Infuse into a central venous access device at a maximum rate of 0.5 g/kg/hour (1 mL/kg/hour).

Monitoring

Rapid injection of 25–30 g over 3 minutes may cause a generalised flush which subsides within 10 minutes.

Hydration status as hypertonic glucose solutions may cause dehydration.

Blood glucose levels

Potassium

1st Trimester: Safe to use
 2nd Trimester: Safe to use
 3rd Trimester: Safe to use

Comments

Glucose 50% is hypertonic so IV administration may cause local pain, vein irritation, local phlebitis or venous thrombosis. Inject slowly and avoid extravasation.
