Antimicrobial Restriction – Restricted

Presentation	Tablet: 3mg					
Dose	Norwegian Scabies (Crusted Scabies)					
	Use in combination with topical scabicide; refer to:					
	KEMH Adult Medication Monograph: <u>Scabicides and Pediculicides</u> (Topical)					
	Oral:					
	200microg/kg for 3, 5 or 7 doses depending on severity and clinical response in the first week					
	3 dose regimen: give on days 1, 2, 8					
	• 5 dose regimen: give on days 1, 2, 8, 9, 15					
	• 7 dose regimen: give on days 1, 2, 8, 9, 15, 22, 29					
	Scabies in immunocompromised patients					
	Oral: 200microg/kg once weekly until scrapings from a burrow are negative and there is no further clinical evidence of infestation.					
Administration	Oral					
	Take with fatty food.					
Pregnancy	1 st Trimester: Consider alternative					
	2 nd Trimester: Consider alternative					
	3 rd Trimester: Consider alternative					
Breastfeeding	Considered safe to use.
