Formulary: Unrestricted

SAS Category A (item requires approval by TGA)

Medication Class

Beta-blockers

Presentation

Tablet (SAS): 100mg (SAS), 200mg (SAS)

Storage

Store at room temperature, below 30°C

Dose

Hypertension

Oral:

Initially 100mg twice to three times a day, increase each week according to response to 200-400mg twice to three times a day. Maximum of 2400mg in 3 or 4 divided doses.

Administration

<u>Oral</u>

Food increases absorption. Give after food.

Monitoring

Blood pressure upon standing, particularly within 1-3 hours of initial dosage increment.

Pregnancy

1st Trimester: Considered safe to use.
2nd Trimester: Monitoring required
3rd Trimester: Monitoring required
