## **⚠**HIGH RISK Medication

Class	Benzodiazepine		
Presentation	Tablet: 1mg, 2.5mg		
Storage	Store at room temperature, below 25°C		
	Schedule 4 Restricted Medication		
Dose	Anxiety Oral: 2-3mg (up to 4mg) daily in 1-3 doses		
	Insomnia Oral: 1-2mg at night.		
	Premedication  Oral: 2–4 mg the night before and/or 1–2 hours before the procedure.		
Administration	Oral  Can be taken with or without food		
Pregnancy	1 <sup>st</sup> Trimester: Considered safe to use.  2 <sup>nd</sup> Trimester: Considered safe to use.  3 <sup>rd</sup> Trimester: Monitoring required.		
Breastfeeding	Considered safe to use.		
Monitoring	Drowsiness. Long term use may result in tolerance and dependence; restrict use to short-term (2-4 weeks) or intermittent use only.		

	Suddenly stopping treatment (or reducing or tapering the dose too quickly) in dependent people may produce withdrawal symptoms.
