Class	Antimetabolite, folic acid antagonist			
Presentation	Tablet: 2.5mg, 10mg Injection (Prefilled Syringes): • 5mg/0.2mL • 50mg/0.5ml • 60mg/0.6mL • 70mg/0.7mL • 75mg/0.75mL • 80mg/0.8mL • 90mg/0.9mL • 100mg/mL • 125mg/1.25mL • Other strengths may be available for specific patients – contact pharmacy for further advice			
Storage	Store at room temperature, below 25°C			
Dose	Refer to relevant KEMH Clinical Guidelines for appropriate dose regimes (links below)			
Administration	*CYTOTOXIC – Use cytotoxic handling precautions* (link below) Oral Dose is administered ONCE WEEKLY. Give with or soon after food. IM injection Preferred route for treatment of ectopic pregnancy. Inject into buttock or lateral thigh. Injection is yellow. Intraectopic injection By senior medical staff only.			

	May be injected into the ectopic pregnancy sac laparoscopically or transvaginally under ultrasound guidance. Injection is yellow.			
Pregnancy	1 st Trimester: Contraindicated			
	2 nd Trimester: Contraindicated			
	3 rd Trimester: Contraindicated			
Breastfeeding	High chemotherapy doses: Contraindicated			
	For breastfeeding patients receiving a single systemic dose for ectopic pregnancy: Express and discard milk for 24 hours. For high doses (>75mg or dosing more than once weekly), express and discard milk for 2-4 days.
