Alpha-blocker (selective)

Presentation

Form: 1mg, 2mg, 5mg

# Storage

Store at room temperature, below 25°C

## Dose

#### **Hypertension**

#### Oral:

Initially 0.5mg twice daily. Increase slowly to 1mg two or three times daily. Maintenance dose 3-20mg in 2 or 3 divided doses.

# Administration

## <u>Oral</u>

Take with or without food

# Monitoring

First dose effect - orthostatic hypotension (increase dose slowly to avoid)

## Pregnancy

1<sup>st</sup> Trimester: Consider alternative

2<sup>nd</sup> Trimester: Monitoring required

**3<sup>rd</sup> Trimester:** Monitoring required
