# **Medication Class**

Local Anaesthetics

#### **Presentation**

#### Form:

Ampoule: 0.2% (20mg/10mL) Ampoule: 0.75% (75mg/10mL) Ampoule: 1% (200mg/20mL) Bag: 0.2% (400mg/200mL)

#### **Combination Product:**

Bag: 0.2% with Fentanyl 4microg/mL (200mL)\*

\*Formulary: Restricted and Schedule 8 Medication for combination with fentanyl

# **Storage**

Store at room temperature, below 25°

#### Dose

#### **Epidural Analgesia:**

The dose used varies depending on factors such as the area to be anaesthetised, vascularity of tissues, number of neuronal segments to be blocked, individual tolerance and techniques used. Consult anaesthetist.

Ropivacaine 0.2% at dosage rates of 4-12mL/hr is often one of the medications used with pethidine or fentanyl initially in the epidural infusion.

#### **Rectus Sheath Catheter:**

10 - 20 mL of Ropivacaine 2mg/mL (0.2%) via each catheter should be prescribed regularly, 6 hourly, for the first 72 hours. The volume of local anaesthetic prescribed is dependent upon patient weight: e.g. 40-50kg 10mL, 50-60kg 15mL and >70kg 20 mL 6 hourly.

# **Contraindications:**

IV Injection, IV Infusion

#### **Administration**

Refer to the <u>Australian Injectable Drugs Handbook</u>

#### **Epidural Infusion or Rectus Sheath Catheter**

Dilute with sodium chloride 0.9% injection when concentrations lower than those available commercially are required.

# **Monitoring**

Monitor blood pressure, heart rate, and vital signs during administration.

# **Pregnancy**

1<sup>st</sup> Trimester: Considered safe to use
 2<sup>nd</sup> Trimester: Considered safe to use
 3<sup>rd</sup> Trimester: Considered safe to use

# **Breastfeeding**

Safe to use

#### **Comments**

IV injection or infusion of ropivacaine is contraindicated
