Formulary: Restricted

Medication Class

Guanine Analogue

Presentation

Tablet: 500mg

Storage

Store at room temperature, below 25°C

Dose

Varicella/Herpes Zoster (Chicken Pox/Shingles) Treatment

Oral:

1g orally, 8-hourly for 7 days

Herpes Simplex Virus in Pregnancy:

Recurrent HSV - episodic treatment

Oral:

500mg orally, 12-hourly for 3 days

Recurrent HSV – prophylactic treatment from 36 weeks gestation

Oral:

500mg orally, 12-hourly until delivery

Higher suppressive dose is required due to altered metabolism of antiviral therapy and the altered metabolism of the drug in pregnancy

Primary Outbreak HSV

Oral:

500mg orally, 12-hourly for 5 days

Administration

Oral

Drink plenty of fluids - at least 1.5L daily

Monitoring

Dose reduction required in renal impairment

Pregnancy

1st Trimester: Considered safe
 2nd Trimester: Considered safe
 3rd Trimester: Considered safe

There is more experience with aciclovir in pregnancy. Valaciclovir is a pro-drug of aciclovir and is generally considered safe to use in pregnancy
