



Your first appointment at the Gynae-Oncology Service at King Edward Memorial Hospital

Please find attached details of your first appointment with the Gynaecologic Oncology Service. This service is located in the West Wing Clinic at King Edward Memorial Hospital (KEMH). Directions to the clinic are located on the back of your appointment letter.

Using the information supplied by your referring doctor we have scheduled your appointment according to the urgency of your situation and available appointments at our clinic.

You should telephone the Gynecological Oncology Liaison Nurses if you wish to cancel or change your appointment, or you have any questions regarding your consultation.

Country patients should contact their nearest Patient Assisted Transport Scheme (PATS) office as soon as they receive an appointment from KEMH to help with the costs of transport and accommodation. Your doctor can provide you with details of your nearest PATS office.

Please do not arrive at the clinic until 15 minutes before your appointment time, which could take approximately three hours or longer if you also need to visit a Pre-Admission Clinic after your appointment.

All country patients and patients whose surgery is booked for the week following their appointment will be asked to stay for the Pre-Admission Clinic, which starts at 1.00pm.

Assistance available

Parking

Parking near KEMH is difficult to find and often limited to two hours. The map on the back of this letter displays the various locations where parking may be available to you.

Bus Route 27 stops right outside the front door of the hospital on Bagot Road.

The closest train stations are Daglish (670 metres) and Subiaco (1 km). Planning your route by public transport is made easy by using the website www.transperth.com.au.

All referrals are triaged by a Gynaecology Consultant and are allocated a category status.
